

So in case you have not guessed, the **thunder** portion was the Panoz Showroom and Museum and the **lightning** was the Dawsonville Moonshine Distillery.




CGCC was presented with the Club Participant Award. Volunteers will be needed next year at Petit, so if you are interested please let me know.



St. Louis Closes Down and Bowling Green Opens Up... the C3 evolves into the C4

wing my lifetime I have moved on several occasions and each time I promised the good Lord that I would never move again. Given my measily experience with moving I cannot begin to fathom what it must have been like for Chevrolet, more specifically Corvette, to move from SL Louis, Missourt, to Bowling Green, Kentucky; a driving distance of approximately 280 miles. However, the move is more about the complexity of literally moving an automotive manufacturing plant.

In the interim, it should be noted that the last Corvette mede in St. Louis was a white 1981 coupe (VIN 31611; July 31, 1981; It took 22 hours to build a Corvette at St. Louis so the car technically rolled off the assembly line on August 1, 1960. This also marked the end of an era ... say goodbye to the C3. First brought to the public's eye in 1968, the C3 had a tremendous run through 1982. (We all know what happened in 1983)) Interestingly, the 1982 Corvette (C3) was the last of an era, but the first Corvette to be built in the new BG plant. In reality, the BG plant was up and running during the last two months that St. Louis was in operation. The first Corvette rolled off the BG assembly line June 1, 1981.

Can you even begin to imagine the sleepless nights around the corporate

offices as an entire brand (including assembly line) was moved from the center of the industrial north to the heartland of blue grass and the vast horse ranches of the south? I can hear it now, "Hey y'all, I'm the moving van driver from Kentucky and Lam here to move your stuff!" Along with hardware there were also the people to think about. Many of the workers from the St. Louis plant had spent years there and they, too, had an affinity for the car and their jobs. It is reported that upwards of 1,500 workers made the move to Kentucky.

I suppose it was only fitting that a new generation of Corvette should come out of the new plant. The C4 was most definitely that as it represented the latest in forward thinking in terms of style, aerodynamic design and exceptional handling. Of course, none of the auto manufacturers had figured out the emissions versus horsepower thingy, it would be another decade before cars, and especially the decade before cars, and especially the powerplants that not only produced horse.

power but also began to give a glimpse of the future and those spectacular miles per gallon readings. (A quick fact about the 1982 Corvette According to the good folks at Corvette Black Book: A manual tranny waan't available in '82 making it and the '83 and '54 Corvettes as the only ones that didn't after a manual transmission. These were automatic only cars.)




One significant difference between the C3 and the C4 came in the form of body prep for paint. And it was the inability of the St. Louis plant to meet the latest EPA doctrine that began the wheels turning at Chevrolet to move the manufacturing plant. (Did you know that the original BG plant was a factility once owned by Chrysler to make air-conditioning components and was purchased by General Motors in 19787) The 1984 (C4) Corvette was designed so that the "pain in the butt" fiberglass seams on the exposed body panels were eliminated. This then eliminated factory finishing. These seams were now under the rub molding, which ran around the body.

For those of you that haven't made a pilgrimage to the Convette manufacturing plant or to the National Convette Museum or to the NCM Motorsports Park (across the freeway from the museum and plant) ... you have to put it on your bucket list. For those of you that haven't moved ... well, resist the temptation for as long as you cant WEITER.

- Mystery Cruise Harriette Majoros did a great job. It was a fun ride and nobody got lost. Best part was the Panoz showroom and museum which closed to the public for our event.
- Several of the club members attended the Mad Vettes Car Show in Emerson after the picnic.

Ken thanked the Wait Staff which was met with a round of applause.

Ken introduced two of our guest speakers, Merrill Baker and Bryan Logan with McKenna Farms, a charity we support.

- Merrill is the Development Director and discussed the programs that are provided to kids from birth to age 21. They treated 756 kids in 2017. She mentioned the Special Olympics Equestrian Team which has 13 kids involved and that they would be competing in two weeks. She invited us to attend their Fall Festival, Saturday, October 13 from 11 am to 4pm. If you would like to volunteer, please see Tom Jarrett.
- Bryan Logan is the Veterans Program Manager and a Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor. He discussed their work with veterans, currently there are 23. There are 18 horses which the vets learn to care for and ride as part of their recovery process. This program is very dependent on donations and grants as insurance will not cover unless they are under the care of a Certified Clinician.
- Tom Jarrett then presented the Club's donation check in the amount of \$1,000 which is specified for use for McKenna's Aquatic Center Building Fund.

Our third guest speaker, Denver Dexter, owner of The Party Touch, was introduced. He is a mobile DJ and has recently started working in senior centers. He would like to know if we would be interested in having a small car show at centers when he is playing. At this time, there is no specific date, however, if we would like to consider, Alan Rubin is the point of contact.

Linda Zeppenfeld, Secretary announced that there was a correction to the September 11 minutes. 


