## TRACK SAFETY RULES

SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY!!!!



Let's help make CABC-IX a safe event! SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY.



Please help us by correcting or reporting unsafe acts or issues immediately. Thanks

to your cooperation, all CABC events have been SAFE! Help us by thoroughly reading and following the 25 TRACK SAFETY RULES as listed. Thanks in advance for your cooperation.

RULE#1 - Absolutely no racing on the track!!!!

RULE#2 - NEVER, NEVER, NEVER pass the Atlanta Motor Speedway Pace Car.

RULE#3 - All laps are paced at an average of 80MPH.

RULE#4 - Always follow the AMS Pace Car.

RULE#5 - ONLY LICENSED DRIVERS are allowed to drive on the track!



RULE#6 – Individuals with learners permits or unlicensed to drive (regardless of age) are not allowed to drive on the track or operate a vehicle of any type in the garage or pit staging areas!!!!

RULE#7 – Licensed drivers under the age of 21 years (but not less than 17 years of age) must be accompanied by a legal guardian while on the track and in staging areas.

RULE#8 – INDIVIDUALS UNDER THE AGE OF 17 ARE NOT ALLOWED TO DRIVE OR OPERATE A VEHICLE ON OR OFF THE TRACK OR IN

ANY STAGING AREA.

RULE#9 - All drivers and passengers are to use seat belts while driving on or off the track.



RULE#10 - Passengers requiring child car seats/booster car seats are not allowed as passengers on the track.



RULE#11 - While on the track the minimum speed is 70 mph.

RULE#12 – Never drive beyond your capabilities. Slowing down (not less than 60 mph) or exiting the track early is ok especially if maintaining the minimum speed is outside of your comfort level. We can re-sequence the remainder of your track laps to occur with a slower group of participants. This is not a problem and we are happy to accommodate you. Remember we are "safety first"!

CONTINUED - TRACK SAFETY RULES 13 THROUGH 25...





RULE#14 – Try not to pass other participants (but never the pace

car) unless necessary... and never, never for racing purposes. If passing is necessary and where practicable pass on the right of the approaching car. Always telegraph your intention to pass.

RULE#15 – Be mindful of your position in relationship to other cars especially while on the track. While on the track check your position in relationship to other participants always. Check your side and rear view mirrors from time to time.

RULE#16 - Garage and staging areas are potential hazard areas. We are expecting over 350 people and 250 plus cars this year. Activity will center in and around the garage area so alertness of the surroundings is paramount.

RULE#17 - Remember... Headlights and or marker lamps are on at all times. We are driving at dust in to the night and under the lights!





RULE#19 - Follow the instructions of the event staff.

RULE#20 - Exhibit safe behavior at all times.

RULE#21 - Cars deemed unsafe due to mechanical issues are not allowed on the track (bad tires, leaking fluids, general appearance of the vehicle indicates poor condition).

RULE#22 – Safety is everyone's responsibility and inherently are accountable to identify, correct or report unsafe acts or issues immediately.

RULE#23 – Standing in the apron area is prohibited. Never walk beyond the pit area towards the track (grassy apron area immediately adjacent to the track).

RULE#24 - Participants who experience a breakdown while on the track should remain in the vehicle with hazard lights on. Wrecker service is available to assist you.

RULE#25 – Remember to sign your waiver forms before entering the track.

Track rules are designed to benefit all participants. Rule violations, exhibiting unsafe behavior or failure to follow the instructions of event staff may result in removal from the event without refund of any funds or fees.

Remember "doing the right thing is not always the cool thing but is most likely the safe thing"... most of us are not professional drivers.
